Pastor's Pen

How frightening and uncertain are these days! The political situation in our nation has been described as a cold civil war – and it is dangerously close to becoming hot. The economy is precarious with the federal government carrying trillions of dollars of debt. Most states, cities, corporations, and individuals are also drowning in debt. The slightest bump and the entire house of cards will collapse. On top of all of that you may be carrying some worry or burden that completely overwhelms you.

Where can we find peace, security, guidance and strength for living in such days? How can we carry the burdens of our own lives?

The writer of Psalm 91 knew the answer. He wrote, "He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty" (verse 1). God was the psalmist's source of security and strength.

How can we experience God's peace and strength? The psalmist gave the clear answer – "He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High." That means that we are to seek the Lord and walk with Him. We must prioritize our relationship with Him. In verse 2 the psalmist added, "I will say to the Lord, 'My refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust!'" We must walk in fellowship with the Lord.

What do we experience if we walk with the Lord? We will have His intervention. He will personally work in our lives and circumstances. Verse 3 says, "For it is He who delivers you from the snare of the trapper and from the deadly pestilence." God Himself will work in our situations and circumstances. Instead of us trying to carry our burdens or solve our problems we can experience God working in our lives!

We will also experience God's presence. We will know the personal presence of the Lord. The psalmist wrote, "He will cover you with His pinions, and under His wings you may seek refuge; His faithfulness is a shield and bulwark" (verse 4). What is there to fear, worry or dread when God is so close? Nothing! If we draw near to God, He will draw near to us in powerful and wonderful ways (Jeremiah 29:13).

Last, we will also experience God's wonderful plans for us. Verse 16 reads "With a long life I will satisfy him and let him see My salvation." We will experience God fulfilling the plans He has for us.

Yes, these are difficult days. But our God is real and greater than all our problems. Let's draw near to Him.

Packing and Praying
